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## How to join the Catney Residents Association

Annual fees are due now and are £10 for a family of 4 or more over 16's living in the same house, £5 for a couple and £3 for a single membership. ## **RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION AGM - A summary for those who did not attend.**

Over 30 people braved a chilly evening to attend the AGM last month, including Gill Shalley from Hampton Parish Council and Mark Sullivan from CPRE. Dave Cuthbert outlined the Residents Association activities over the past year: monitoring and commenting on planning applications, taking an active role on various airport committees, working with HPC to maintain the Common and working with the Village Hall Trustees. We continue to produce and distribute the monthly newsletter free of charge which goes out to all homes in the village. Some events had to be cancelled this year, but the Buttie breakfasts, the Skittles night and the Christmas Carols around the Tree were great successes. Money raised from the Skittles night paid for the Christmas Tree. New ideas are welcome and we need more volunteers to join the Committee or organise an event. Ken Cluley presented the accounts and proposed a vote of thanks to Dave for all the work he does to support the community.

Mark, from CPRE explained their response to the MSA proposal and also suggested a new position for the HS2 station alongside Birmingham International. In their view there are sufficient, valid planning reasons for Solihull Council to turn down the MSA application regardless of any decision to be made by Highways England. He felt that more pressure should be put on Solihull planners to reject the proposal and it was agreed that the Residents' Association would try to arrange a meeting with local councillors, MPs and the Council.

Steve Wallis described the progress made by the Village Hall Trustees: The bell tower has been removed and restored. The hall has been painted and cleaned, and is being used more, so the rental income now covers the running expenses. A professional fundraiser is working for the Trustees and £10,000 has been donated by the Big Lottery Fund. The next project is to improve the kitchen and toilet area.

# UPDATES FROM THE R.A. COMMITTEE

## Airport

The Association attended the meeting of the Birmingham Airport Consultative Committee which will be reported on next month.

The Airport have been holding trials relating to increasing the altitude of the Noise Preferential Routes from 3000ft to 4000ft on runway 15 ( southbound departures ) and runway 33 ( northbound departures ) hoping to reduce noise levels . The results are:- for runway 15 departures using option 6 going south BAL will be increasing the height ( subject to CAA approval) and for northbound routes using runway 15 they are carrying out redesign work on northbound and conventional SIDs ( Standard Instrument Departures) and any changes to the NPR will be in line

with this work , Info on runway 33 departures can be seen on the Catney website. Full details on the trials, decisions and minutes of the meeting can be viewed shortly on the Catney website.

## Village Hall

Internal deep cleaning of the internal are of the hall was recently completed thanks to a couple of volunteers organised by Annette Scott – looks great! Thanks Annette for all your help and pass on our thanks to the volunteers.

New curtains are on order and will hopefully be in place around middle March – financed by some donations and from monies from the Catfog fete funds; monies raised over previous years to be used to improve village amenities and environment .

Plans were on display at the residents AGM showing the project for new toilets, kitchen, and storage we are hoping to proceed with when funds are available. Quotations for the work are being sought and our fund raiser will be applying for grants as soon as this info is available. As part of the project we are hoping to purchase 100 new upholstered folding chairs with storage trolleys, new boiler and electrics. A copy of the plans will be put up in the hall and the noticeboards shortly for all to view.
