Following the AGM, Glenn Hayes has kindly sent us details on how to find crime figures for any area.

Here is the crime stats web site:

On the right is a blue box, type in your postcode click search. Once it gives you the results, scroll down and change the distance ratio to 1/2 mile (more representative of the village I'd say).

The map will be for December. However, if you look below it breaks down the crime rate by month going back some years. It's clear, since September 2015, there's been spikes in Burglary every now and then. But we weren't immune before that, however September 2015 is definitely the 'turning' point.

The attached spreadsheet gives a summary of crime over several years. It shows, conclusively, we're under attack when it comes to burglary.

Luckily, we're still a low crime area with very little other crime. For comparison, pick other postcodes and take a look.

The AGM held on 19th February

The meeting was very well attended 65 residents filling the hall for the event. A copy of the Chair's and Treasurer's Report are able to be viewed on the Catney website www.catney.co.uk or if you require a hard copy please let us know .

The Committee comprising Dave Cuthbert, Chair, Frances Cook, Secretary, Ken Cluley, Treasurer, Chris Cluley and Annette Scott were re-elected for another year . We would like a small team to arrange social events, if you would like to join this team, please contact Frances.

Stephen Wallis provided a brief update of the Village Hall. Bookings are running at a level which has enabled us to cover running costs and we are looking at the possibility in the next few months of refurbishing the floor which as many of you will know has had little attention over the last 20+ years. The Trustees are also in the process of applying for a number of grants that would enable the refurbishment of the kitchen, toilets as well as a possible full re-wire.

An easy way to raise funds for the Village Hall while buying online is by joining easyfundraising.com with Catherine de Barnes Village Hall as your chosen charity and when you make a purchase on Amazon for example you use the easyfundraising website which offers a large numbers of retailers for you to select from and make your purchase in the normal manner .

The main topic of discussion at the end of the meeting related to the recent attack on a resident in Lugtrout Lane. Some users of the Cat's Eyes group (the WhatsApp Group set up to exchange information on suspicious activity of one sort or another) suggested we look at hiring a private security company to patrol the village after dark. A couple of villages (somewhat larger than ours) seem to run a similar scheme. Prior to the meeting some costings were obtained from a local security company which amounted to £75K plus VAT for 1 man with a vehicle for 84 hours per week. It would need every house to pay nearly £300 per year to cover this cost and it was evident from the response to the quick e mail survey that we sent out prior to the meeting that not everybody felt comfortable with the idea. We are making enquiries as to other measures that we might but in the meantime would urge all residents who have a Smart Phone to join the Whatsapp group Cat's Eyes simply by emailing elstonc@sky.com with your name and mobile number.

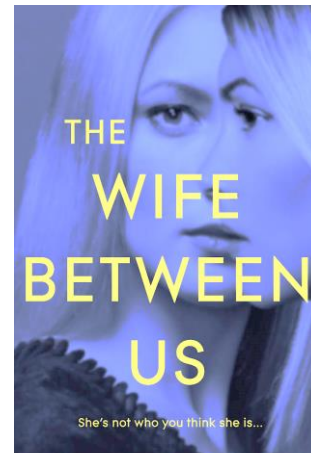

THE WIFE BETWEEN US

A Novel by Greer Hendricks and Sarah Pekkanen

These two American women, one a book editor – Greer Hendricks – and a well published author – Sarah Pekkanen, agreed to come together to write a novel jointly, but unlike most co-operative writing, when the two writers will pen individual chapters of characters, these two wrote every line between them which is a very interesting and unusual concept.



They have put together a very clever psychological thriller which appears to be following a predictable path until it veers off towards a more fascinating ending.

The basic story, which is told primarily by Vanessa, who is recently divorced from Richard, who appears to be a control freak, is about Vanessa wanting to warn Nellie, her soon-to-be replacement as Richards's wife, all about him and to prevent the marriage going ahead.

The twists and turns start early and there is a cracking finish. I've seen it described as an airport book, which is probably appropriate, but there is some good writing in here describing some very believable characters and situations.
