

Christine wakes every morning with no memory of her life since she was young. Developments

In order to further promote use of the hall a website is being developed and this will include a calendar, enquiry form, details of the hire conditions and hire charges. There will be a link to the website from the Residents Association site. It has been many years the hire charges have been increased so these will be reviewed this year.

CATNEY HISTORY

Before and during William the Conqueror's reign, the lands around Catney were held by one Almar for Turchil de Warwick – part of the manor of Longdone. From 1100, during the reign of Henry 1, the area was owned by Chetelberne of Ketelbarnus, who gave land on which to build a nunnery in the Henwood Lane area, then called Estwell.

The nunnery was dedicated to St. Margaret and the Benedictine nuns were given all tithes within the precinct of Solihull by Pope Gregory 1V. Afterwards the name of Estwell was discarded and the nunnery was called Heanwood.


By 1389 it was a house of about 56 nuns, the reigning monarch still being benefactor of the nunnery. As time passed however, the number of nuns dwindled to twelve.

Henry V111 dissolved Heanwood as he did other monasteries and convents. What became of the poor creatures whose only known home was ruthlessly taken from them, we shall never know. The prioress, however, was granted a retirement annuity of £3. 6s 8d. Thus passed Heanwood nunnery, leaving us with Henwood Lane as a memorial.



CATNEY COMMON

Work has been carried out on the Common; volunteers have been clearing overgrown areas (many thanks to everyone who has helped) and new features are appearing all the time as part of the continuous improvement programme between our Residents Association and Hampton Parish Council. It is hoped to have a couple of picnic tables and some other natural seating in place soon. Why not have a stroll and look for signs of spring. Bulbs have been planted on the Bickenhill Lane side and there is something new to find every time you visit. You can help with this improvement by going along to the next Catney Common clearance, due to be held on 31st March. Contact our Secretary, Frances to get times etc. Tools will be provided although you can obviously bring your own if you prefer and you will be made most welcome.

A WALK FROM CATNEY TO MARSTON GREEN

- 10A Grand Union Canal** From the towpath at Henwood Wharf, proceed northwards on towpath (canal on left); bear R off towpath onto track at wooden chicken house to Catherine-de-Barnes
- 11A Catherine-de-Barnes** TR to roundabout and follow Solihull Road; cross stile at farthest corner of Hampton Lane Farm; follow muddy track round to the R to stile by gate; TL, following hedge to top of field; TL and follow hedge (on right) - to Catherine-de-Barnes Lane; TR and X to stile after 90 paces; bear L to hedge corner and TR across the field approximately parallel to hedge on L - to stile to left of Gaelic football (rugby) posts' follow hedge alongside football ground; just past pavilion (footbridge down on R), TL across narrow field to steps leading down to footbridge; bear R diagonally across field towards area of thicker vegetation (about 3/4 way up right hand field boundary) - to stile by gate; follow hedge on L and make for stile to R of Castle Hills Farm (12A) (8km/5m).
- 12A Castle Hills Farm** Go round to R of farm building and follow track down to footbridge - follow hedge on L to stile where path is enclosed between fence and hedge; TL at Damson Parkway; X dual carriageway and take road (signposted Elmdon Church/Public Bridleway) between Land Rover Works and Golf Range/Restaurant, after Land Rover fence TL into Elmdon Park (13).
- 13 Elmdon Park** Walk up hill approximately parallel with road, towards old gnarled sweet chestnut tree; continue beyond to beacon and follow line of trees to exit road from car park; at junction of tracks continue straight ahead; TL along track with Elmdon Grange on R; follow path through woodland fringe planted area to housing; cross Victor Road and Rangoon Road to A45 Coventry Road and enter Birmingham, X at crossing and TR; TL between cottages (Tiger Island Cottages) (11km/6.8m) to Birmingham International Airport boundary fence (14).
- 14 Birmingham International Airport** Follow fence with Hatchford Brook Golf Course on left; continue round to end of runway and head for bridge under railway (13.3km/8.2m) for the continuation of the walk northwards.
- 15 Marston Green** For those wishing to pick up a bus at Marston Green Station, cross over Hatchford Brook and continue up the hill, back into Solihull, to Elmdon Lane; TL, cross over footbridge to bus stops (15) (14km/8.7m).

TR = Turn right X = Cross TL = Turn Left

Catney Residents Association

Over a year ago, following the last church service being held there, the Residents Association began our fight to save Catney Church building from being sold. We wanted it to remain as a Village Hall for the use of the Village of Catney and as part of this endeavour, we managed to get its inclusion on the Council's Local List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest. We thought you might like to see the reasoning behind their decision to include it.

"This imposing building is of significant local importance and interest in the streetscene. That it is the work of an architect of regional and national note adds to its importance. It clearly has historical interest in terms of its design and materials. In design, materials and detailing it is impressive in both an immediately local and Borough-wide context. Its domestic scale and signature chimneystacks were clearly intended to create a building acknowledging vernacular building and striving to respect the scale of the small village.

The building is clearly of sufficient architectural and historic interest to justify its inclusion on the Council's Local List of Buildings of Special Architectural or Historic Interest"

As most of you know, we continue our plan to keep the building for the village, with the formation of a secondary committee who will initially raise funds specifically for the purpose of costs that will be involved.. We hope to be able to update you on this project at our AGM. We thank all of you for your continued support and ask that you try and attend any functions held in the coming year.

As the Catney News is being sent to all villagers this month, with an additional sheet for your completion and return with your subscriptions, we thought we would advise those who are thinking about joining, of the voluntary duties undertaken by the Residents Association Committee. We are always glad to get new Committee members if you would be interested..

We monitor planning in the village and surrounds to ensure it does not encroach on green belt or look out of place in it's surroundings.

We look at environmental issues, e.g. working with Hampton in Arden Parish council to improve the Common, getting footpaths cleared, any dangerous trees or overgrown areas that are causing problems etc. This also involves attending regular meetings at the airport and monitoring flight paths and fall-out emissions.

We look at street lighting, speeding through the village, and improvements that are not only needed, but would add to the ambience and overall appearance of the village.

We attend any necessary meetings that enable us to put forward your views and assist the village in general.

We produce the Catney News each month and have our own website to help with communication between villagers.

We organise functions throughout the year to bring villagers together.

We liaise with Council representatives and local councillors who attend our regular committee meetings, to get their backing and help with problems or planned improvements.

We hope this will encourage your support and look forward to you joining us.
