SKYLARK BUS FOR THE YOUTH OF THE AREA

As some of you may remember from previous articles in this newsletter, Hampton invested in a Youth Bus some time ago, as a base for young people to meet, socialise and do their homework in safety. We are delighted that this facility has now been extended to the youth of Catney, on a Wednesday evening. School years 4 - 6 can go along from 6.30 pm until 7.45 pm and School years 7 – 9 from 7.45 pm to 9 pm. £1 per session. It is well equipped and run by a group of approximately 20 volunteers (all DBS checked), who take it in turns to be there and supervise (4 at each event). So far, it has raised £353 and this is still increasing, which is wonderful.



BOOK REVIEW

THE SUDDEN DEPARTURE OF THE FRASERS

A novel by Louise Candlish

Louise Candlish is the author of eight or nine novels, *The Sudden Departure of the Frasers* being her latest.

This is a very gripping thriller which I very much enjoyed and it is worth reproducing a quotation from the book which intriguingly sets the scene for the story. *My name is Amber Fraser. I've just moved in at number 40, Lime Park Road. You'll come to think of me as a loving wife, a thoughtful neighbour and a trusted friend. This is a lie.*

The story is about Christy and Joe Davenport moving into number 40 as a dream come true. It has been offered to them at a ridiculously low price for such a property in a very desirable area, but is dependent upon an immediate sale.

Strangely, when they move in to the property which has been very expensively renovated by the Frasers who lived in it for less than a year, the neighbours won't speak to them and with Joe working very long hours, Christy is left alone to try to solve the mystery of the Frasers.

What follows, told separately by Amber and Christy is a tale of manipulation, brought about by love and obsession which will keep you guessing until the final page – and possibly beyond. It is a subtle, clever, perceptive story with really well drawn characters which reminds one of a Hitchcock production.

I thoroughly recommend it.
