Having just completed the current refurbishment project, we will not proceed with this project until we have a boosted our funds a little.

Good news at last - According to our contacts at Skanska, we will be able to access the above using Catherine de Barnes Lane and the new dual carriageway from 19/12 thus avoiding the two diversion rotes we have grown to love !!

Village Traffic Calming Measures

Highways have indicated that they have finished the design for the scheme and the PC /RA are hoping to arrange a meeting with them sometime in December to discuss it. On the basis that the designs are ok we will arrange a final open village meeting in the Hall late January/early February in order that the proposals can be viewed prior to work starting in summer 25. 
WELCOME PACK FOR NEW RESIDENTS



BOOK REVIEW by JOHN ALDERSON

CLOSE TO DEATH A Novel by Anthony Horowitz



Horowitz has the ability to delight and annoy, not in equal measure, more often delight but his use of putting himself into his story's alongside his protaganist Hawthorne, can occasionally irritate.

Close to death takes the title from Riverview Close, a gated community of only six homes. Which when one householder is murdered seemingly limits the number of suspects, particularly when there are additional pointers for the police to follow. Hawthorne and is assistant John Dudley, reluctantly called in to help the police are sceptical about their conclusions as to who is responsible for the killing.

The story is in two parts, the first being the above and the second when Hawthorne and Dudley return to the scene a few years later to try to reopen the case as they didn't agree with the original verdict.

An excellent author telling a fascinating story. I really enjoyed it.



BOOK REVIEW by JOHN ALDERSON

FIRST LIE WINS Psychological Thriller by Ashley Elston



This is a very interesting psychological thriller told in fractured sort of way and by an author new to me, Ashley Elston.

Evie Porter is the central figure, although you are introduced to her by another name, who is controlled by a mysterious Mr. Smith. He gives her tasks to move into another town and become involved in a persons life ,who Mr Smith has an interest but whose motive is not always clear. It is all about control.

The first contact is Ryan Sumner and his friends with whom Evie becomes close finding that he too leads a double life which seems to be what interests Mr. Smith. Also he introduces "Evie Porter" a lookalike with all Evie's personal and background information.

Other assignments are introduced by moving the timeline around but all come together in an interesting and clever way with the help of Devon a highly competent "techy" who also seems to be able to physically move at pace.

All this means you are never quite sure who is in charge or what is actually legal, even up to and including the last page.

I found this a hard book to put down and one which needs your attention but rewards by being such a surprising read.
